BROWN BEARS

When you hear the word bear, the picture that usually comes to mind is that of the brown bear. This is probably not so surprising as the brown bear is to be found in almost every region of the world from North America to Russia. They live in forests and mountain regions. In North America bears that live in interior areas are called grizzlies, whereas those in coastal areas are called brown bears. However, they are the same species.

Brown bears are usually dark brown in colour, but they can vary from a light cream colour to almost black. If the tips of the fur are white, they give the bear a grizzled appearance. That's how the grizzly bear got its name. Brown bears have a hump above their shoulders and long claws. Their front claws are nearly 11 cm long! Brown bears can weigh from 140 to 390 kilos. They are at their heaviest in autumn just before hibernation – their winter sleep. Over the course of winter they may lose a third or more of their body weight.

Like humans and various other mammals, brown bears are omnivorous. They eat a mixed diet of fruit, plants or roots, insects, fish and small animals. They have also been known to attack large animals such as deer. Coastal bears eat a lot of salmon and rich coastal food – that's why their fur is darker than that of inland bears.

Unlike humans, however, brown bears are generally loners, that is apart from mothers with cubs. They are very territorial, in other words, they have an area which they regard as their own. The males have a larger area which overlaps the smaller areas of several females. Their territories are often close to their food supplies, for example, places where lots of berries grow or even town rubbish dumps.

Brown bears are not as rare as the giant panda or the mountain gorilla and aren't protected to the same extent, either. But they are in need of protection. Two of the threats facing the brown bear are the farmers who hunt them, as they believe they are a threat to their livestock, and even worse the poachers who kill them for their skin, teeth, claws and internal organs. These are used in some alternative forms of medicine. Let's hope something more will be done to protect this cuddly-looking member of the animal kingdom.
