The Sun's Big Explosion

On November 11, 2025, the Sun released a very strong solar flare from a large and active sunspot called AR4274. The flare was classified as an X5.1 flare, which means it belonged to one of the most powerful groups of solar eruptions. Scientists explained that the Sun becomes more active every 11 years, and this flare shows that we are now in a period of high solar activity.

The explosion on the Sun also sent out a huge cloud of hot gas and charged particles. This cloud is known as a coronal mass ejection (CME), and it travels through space at very high speed. When a CME is directed toward Earth, it can interact with our planet's magnetic field. Because of this, experts warned that a strong geomagnetic storm was likely to happen after the flare reached Earth.

Geomagnetic storms can affect technology in many ways. They may disturb satellite communication, GPS navigation systems, and even radio signals that pilots and ships sometimes need. In this case, the flare already caused a significant radio blackout, rated R3, over parts of Europe and Africa. During a radio blackout, high-frequency radio waves cannot travel through the atmosphere normally, which makes communication difficult or impossible for a short time.

However, solar storms are not only dangerous — they can also create beautiful natural effects. When the particles from the Sun reach Earth's atmosphere, they can produce bright auroras, also called northern or southern lights. Scientists say that these auroras may appear much farther south than usual, in places where people do not normally see them. Many sky-watchers are excited, because such strong displays of colour in the night sky are rare and can be an amazing experience.
